Senate Passes Parental Bill of Rights

CONCORD, NH – Senator Tim Lang (R-Sanbornton) released the following statement today on the Senate passing SB 72-FN, establishing a parents’ bill of rights in education:

“Granite State parents have a fundamental right and responsibility to direct their children's upbringing, education, and care. New Hampshire parents should decide what is best for their children. When dropping off a child at school, parents do not lose the ability to advocate for their child’s best interests. If parents have questions about what their child is learning or being exposed to, parents deserve to know the truth about what happens in the classroom. Information about a child should never be withheld from parents. Power should be given back to New Hampshire parents, and we must reinforce the idea that parents know what’s best for their own children.”

Background: SB 72-FN creates a parent’s bill of rights, what a violation of said rights means, and a way to notify parents of these rights. Senator Lang is the prime sponsor of this bill.
