Senate Passes Mandatory Minimum Sentences for Fentanyl Dealers

CONCORD, NH – Senator Daryl Abbas (R-Salem) released the following statement today on the Senate passing SB 14-FN and SB 15-FN:

“Ensuring New Hampshire stays the safest state in the nation means keeping drugs and criminals out of the Granite State. Black market Fentanyl is deadly and we are working on keeping it off our streets. Mandatory minimum sentences for drug trafficking will make drug dealers think twice about setting up shop in New Hampshire. We are continuing to fight against drug trafficking, especially with fentanyl-related offenses, for the safety of our state.”

Background: SB 14-FN adds mandatory minimum sentences for fentanyl-related offenses.

SB 15-FN enacts a mandatory minimum sentence for drug dealers when their illegal drugs kill people.

Both bills passed on a party-line vote of 15-8 and 14-9 respectively.
